

Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

SAROC (SA Regional Organisation of Councils) – Mayor Barber Appointed

Council endorsed at the August 2020 ordinary meeting of Council that Mayor Barber be nominated on behalf of the EPLGA group of Councils to sit on the SAROC Committee, Mayor Barber has been appointed.

Delegations Manual

A full review of Council's delegations has been undertaken and the review was presented to Council at the September and October Ordinary Council Meeting, Council endorsed the recommendations.

GMO – Moratorium Lift

Councillor Karp moved a motion at the September meeting without notice to request more time and more consultation regarding Council's decision to support the lifting of the Moratorium. The motion lapsed due to a lack of a seconder.

Representation Review Options

Division 2 of the *Local Government Act 1999* (LG Act) sets out the requirements for Councils to undertake a Representation Review, including the process which must be undertaken to complete the review. As per the requirements of the LG Act, these reviews are undertaken every 8 years and gazettal by the Attorney-General for Streaky Bay's review has occurred indicating our review must be commenced by October 2020 and concluded in October 2021.

Council was required, prior to the document being placed out to Public Consultation, and in consideration of section 8 of the draft document, to decide on two or three options to include regarding the Ward Structure. One of those options is required to be an option to abolish Wards (as per section 12(6)(b) of the LG Act. Another would be to maintain the current structure and it is recommended one other be chosen to include, though that is not necessary.

Once Council decided on the options to include in the Representation Options Paper, the CEO and Consultant were to finalise the document and have it placed out for Public Consultation. The initial Public Consultation period will be open for 6 weeks as per section 12(7)(a)(ii) of the LG Act. A full copy of the report is available within the October Agenda.

Council resolved at the October meeting the following;

- 1. endorse the format of the Representation Options Paper;
- 2. include options 8.1, 8.5 with 8 elected members and the chairperson elected within the group in section 8 of the Representation Options Paper: and
- 3. direct staff to place the Representation Options Paper out to public consultation once the required options have been included and according to Council's Public Consultation Policy.

BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATION SERVICES

Streaky Bay Area School Pool

Draft three (3) year lease agreement has been received, required funding has been allocated within the Draft Budget, the Agreement was presented at the August 2020 meeting of Council, Council laid the report on the table pending further investigations regarding the employment of the pool staff and seeking further legal advice.

Correspondence was received from the School Governing Council requesting Council formally request that the School engage the pool supervisory staff. A deputation from the School Principal and a further report was presented to the October meeting and Council resolved to;

- authorise the Chief Executive Officer to provide formal written correspondence to the Streaky Bay Area School Governing Council, with a copy provided to the Department of Education representative, requesting that the Agreement be amended to include that the Council will contract the School to provide adequate staff for the public opening hours, and that \$5,500 be provided to the school to cover the cost of staff wages.
- Authorise the Chief Executive Officer to continue to negotiate, finalise and sign off on the Agreement following the appropriate amendments

Correspondence has been forwarded to the school and Council are awaiting further direction.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Skate Park Entrance Signage

Cr Pudney asked a question without notice at the October meeting regarding "Does our skate parks have any terms of entry signage". The Streaky Bay Skate Park as an existing sign with terms of use and risk of use statement, the Community and Economic Development team are currently organising replacement signage for the site.

Council News Cont'd

Removal of Old Engines and Parts – Transfer Station

Council received a report regarding the future of the old Engines and Parts currently located at the Transfer Station. Council resolved to authorise staff to dispose of the assets by way of donation for the purpose of future restoration. Parallel Parking

Cr Wheaton raised as question with notice regarding "what action Council are currently taking or able to take in the future regarding parallel parked caravans and trailers over multiple angled parking spots. Residents and business owners have had enough of the parks being used for a long period of time before moving their vehicles". The Manager, of Infrastructure will provide a response via questions on notice to the November meeting of Council.

COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Photographic Competition

Winners of the competition have been identified and staff are now working through the Calendar layout and future exhibition.

South Australian Regional Visitor Strategy Review

The MCED and CEDO attended a workshop in Ceduna to discuss the review and proposed priorities. There was a limited attendance to this with only DC of Kimba and Streaky Bay attending along with Ceduna Aboriginal Corporation. The general outcomes of this was the Strategies and Priorities will generally remain the same as outcomes from workshops and surveys identified most priorities will remain (except for the for focus on international tourism).

SA Power Networks Customer Consultative Panel Updates

October meeting considered the impacts and work being done around flexible exports and SAPN's solar messaging. On 13 October 2020 South Australia was totally power by alternate energy during daylight hours for more than one hour. The Solar Industry Reference Group is currently focussing on smarter homes and how SAPN will need to position itself to keep up with technologies. The Community Safety Plan was also discussed and messaging around "What you don't know could kill you" will commence roll out soon. The Office of the Technical Regulator (OTR) is meeting with the Arborists group to finalise the list of trees that will be allowed to be planted under or near power lines.

SA Power Networks Regional and Remote Communities Working Group Updates

The focus for this group continues to be Stand Alone Power Supplies (SAPS) and Micro-grid technologies. The SWER Line Focus Groups will commence engagement shortly.

Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park Due Diligence Report

A report will be presented to the Finance Risk and Audit Committee on 10 November 2020, followed by an Elected Member workshop and further discussion at the next Ordinary Council Meeting in November to determine Council's considerations regarding future management of the Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Caravan Park.

This week Council staff farewelled Aud Starkey, who has been a valued of our team, we wish Aud all the best for her future.

Council is pleased to announce the engagement of Dahlena Hammat (Customer Service Officer) – commencing 9 November 2020, and Danielle Bone (Finance Officer) – commencing later in the year.

Dahlena is a local, who has worked for Council previously, and has significant financial knowledge and understanding of Local Government.

Danielle is an Accountant, who is currently working at the Port Pirie Regional Council as a Finance Manager, and who is a new ratepayer to the district having recently built a house in Streaky Bay. As Danielle and her partner have work commitments, she will be joining us later in the year. We welcome Danielle and her family to the district.

Council also loses one of its longest serving employees, Judy Childs, a valued and committed member of our Council team as Judy retires later in the year. Judy has for many years provided executive support to Council's Chief Executive Officers.

Judy is replaced by Mardi Schumann, Mardi has commenced in the role, with a slight change to the current position with Mardi retaining her current role in planning administration as well as the undertaking of executive support to the Chief Executive Officer.

Council sincerely thanks all its staff for their commitment to their work and we welcome the new staff to our team.
