Council News

GOVERNANCE

Finance Risk and Audit Committee

A meeting of the Finance, Risk and Audit Committee was held prior to the November ordinary meeting of Council and from that meeting Council resolved;

- Finance and Risk Work Program 21/22
- Draft Financial Statements 2020/21 and Audit Completions Report
- First Quarter Budget Review for 2021/22
- Register of Policies
- Strategic and Project Reports 2021/22

Asset and Infrastructure Advisory Committee

Council has established a Section 41 Committee of Council to consider reports and information pertaining to strategic asset and infrastructure delivery. The Terms of Reference was established to enable the appointment of both Council members and residents. An Expression of Interest process was undertaken with Council resolving to appoint Craig Kelsh, Geoff Hull and Philip Wheaton as community members.

COMMUNITY

Streaky Bay and District Senior Citizens Homes

Council received a report seeking Council's interest in appointing a Council member to the Board. Council in its consideration resolved to not appoint and received and noted the report.

Streaky Bay Craft and Produce Market

The Craft and Produce Market was not undertaken in 2020 due to both Covid and not being able to form a committee. The Community and Economic Development Team assisted a new group of passionate community members to take on the future markets. The Committee sought from Council a waiver for Hall Fees to host the market and this was granted at the November meeting of Council.

The markets were held on November 28, attracting approximately 30 stall holders and over 500 persons through the door. This is a great community event and opportunity to promote our local businesses.

Streaky Bay Area School Pool

Council have signed a three (3) year agreement with the Minister for Education to open the Pool to the General Public for swimming from November 1- April 30 each year. The Minister for Education will retain ownership and other responsibilities for the pool.

Council have engaged pool attendants, however if you are interested in a casual position please call (08) 86267033.

The pool cannot be opened at this stage as it is subject to repairs and maintenance. Council is awaiting direction from the Department for Education for when the repairs will be completed.

Event Equipment

Council as part of the 2020 Drought Funding allocations purchased a variety of community event equipment. This equipment included;

- Bins / Waste Trailer
- Grandstands
- Event Trailer

Streaky Bay Youth Precinct – Design Concepts

Council will be seeking to engage a skate park specialist to finalise design concepts and engineering for the skate park and overall Youth Precinct project.

Council would like to say a big thank you to the Youth and Community members that have so far participated in the preliminary planning that went a long way towards assisting us with securing the funding for the overall project.

Haslam Playground Swing

The swing has been ordered and will be replaced as soon as possible.

Jetty Pool Shade Shelter and Platform Extension

Design concepts and engineering for an extension to the jetty pool platform and proposed shelter have been completed. An independent design verification is required with engineers recently on site. The Development Approval Application has been submitted and approval from Department of Infrastructure and Transport as the jetty is owned by the department is pending.

Jetty Platform Refurbishment

Reconstruction works on the jetty platform is now underway. The successful contractor, Thirsty Constructions, are beginning to dismantle the deck structure in preparation for the new works. Work zones and safety barriers are to be respected, enabling the contractors to continue works unobstructed.

The aim is to maintain access to the jetty and jetty pool throughout the project timeframe, however there may be short, unavoidable restrictions.

TOURISM AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Tractor Beach Campground

Council and its appointed contractors are continuing to work in an endeavor to have the campground open just prior to the Christmas peak period. With so many competing projects our contractors are working hard to assist us.

Tourism Signage

Council through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Funding program has undertaken to replace and provide new Tourism signage throughout the district. This project is well underway and if you have any further suggestions, please send your suggestions including detailed location description to williamspenny@streakybay.sa.gov.au.

New Year's Eve Children's Festival

Council staff are currently working with SA Health to finalise a Covid Management Plan approval to host the event. Stall holders have been contacted to participate in the event, further information will be provided as it becomes available.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Stormwater Management Plan Review

Council is currently seeking quotes for the review of its Stormwater Management Plan. The Plan was originally developed in 2011 and is therefore ten years old and due for review to consider and include changes in best practice and most importantly meet the future needs of our community.

There will be a significant community engagement process associated with this and the community shall be notified in advance of when this will occur.

Streaky Bay Hall Airconditioning

The main air conditioning units and associated infrastructure have been installed into the main hall building. It was identified during works that an upgrade to power was required to facilitate the cooling infrastructure. Council staff have been liaising with SA Power Networks and unfortunately due a contractor shortage SA Power Networks are unable to complete the works prior to the end of the year. Council will continue to liaise to ensure works are completed as soon as possible.

Poochera Oval Change Rooms Facility

Works are continuing on this facility with walls, roof timbers and roofing installed. This project is due for

completion in early 2022 prior to the commencement of the next Football and Netball Season.

Asset Management Plans – Roads

Council have engaged Tonkin's consulting to assist with the development of long-term asset management plans for Council's infrastructure, with stage 1 being roads. Council staff will soon commence a district wide testing and condition rating that will provided for feedback into a roads database. This project will give Council staff a consolidated record of its existing infrastructure, predicted useful life and replacement schedules. This information can then be fed into long term financial plans and lead to a refined depreciation schedule.

Sealed Road Works

Sealing was recently completed to Back Beach Road and the Wirrulla Township entrances.

Wells Street/AB Smith Road/Wallschutzky Road Development Project

Design concepts were presented to the community for feedback earlier in 2021, where Council considered that feedback and appropriate feedback was given to the consultant engineers. Revised design concepts were endorsed and currently construction drawings are underway. Following the completion of the construction drawings the project components will go out for Tender.

Unsealed Roads Program

8kms of the Gawler Ranges Road from the bitumen has been resheeted. Emerald Rise Road from Whites Road to the oval is currently under construction with Cape Bauer from Anderson Road to Hally's Carpark to commence following the completion of Emerald Rise Road.

Finlayson Road Intersection Design/Upgrade

Intersection design work and lodgment with Lands Title Office for redesign of intersection alignment has been completed. Construction drawings are being sought and negotiations with Department of Infrastructure and Transport are continuing.

Perlubie Land swap

The agreement for a land swap arrangement with private landholder that will ensure the continuation of public access to the beach via the existing roadway has been finalized. Surveying of the area has been completed and applications are currently being developed for the road opening and closing procedures required for this.



The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships (RRES) program

The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships (RRES) program was announced in 2016 as part of the Australian Government's election commitment to improve access, educational opportunities and attainment for regional and remote Australians by supporting undergraduate, postgraduate and vocational education and training students from Certificate IV to PhD level. Scholarships support flexible study arrangements, and are available to eligible students:

- commencing a new course of study in 2021
- studying on campus, online or via distance education
