FRRR Tackling Tough Times Together

The Tackling Tough Times Together (TTTT) program gives drought-affected communities across remote, rural and regional Australia the opportunity to access funds that benefit their immediate and long-term needs

Grants are available for a broad range of grassroots, community-led initiatives that directly and clearly benefit local communities. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis and assessed quarterly.

What can be funded?

This program is designed to provide flexible funding to support community-based activities in drought-affected regions that both help to relieve current stressors and symptoms, and most importantly, build capacity and resilience for the future. Funds could also support activities that engage your local community in being proactive, exploring options and creating something that will stand the test of tough times.

This program funds a broad range of initiatives and purposes, including:

- Delivering activities, programs and services;
- Purchasing or hiring equipment and materials;
- Community infrastructure projects;
- Art, drama and creative expression projects to assist people to creatively express their experiences, which are otherwise limited due to the drought;
- Experiences for school children such as camps that connect young people and provide an opportunity to have fun with other young people off-farm.
- Operational and administrative costs associated with your project will be considered. This could include wages, paying a skilled contractor, or paying for overhead costs incurred in the project's delivery.



Forgiveness.







Great White Kaolin Project

Project Update - April 2021

Great White Kaolin Project

Andromeda Metals Limited (Andromeda) is a South Australian company, undertaking the works to develop the Great White Kaolin Project.

Great White is a small-scale mining operation that will develop a world class deposit of bright white clay called kaolin. The kaolin located within Great White is of exceptional purity and contains a rare type of kaolin known as halloysite. The clay will be used in a number of applications ranging from everyday products, ceramics, paints, pest control and paper through to advanced technology for medicinal uses, air and water purification, soil remediation and battery technology.

The Great White Kaolin Project is a shallow open cut mine. The mining process includes removing clay from the ground, washing and refining it before drying and bagging it for transport and export.

The project will require a capital development cost of around A\$80,000,000. This investment will establish the Great White Project, with a life of over 25 years, to provide generational jobs and opportunities for the region.

Approval process

South Australia has a two-stage approval system.

Stage 1- is attaining a Mining Lease. The application along with a Mining Proposal has been submitted to the Department of Energy and Mining (25 February 2021). The proposal provides government and the community details to understand the how the project will interact with the environment and includes flora and fauna, hydrology, landscape, air quality, communities, businesses, traffic and infrastructure.

Stage 2 - requires an approved management plan called a PEPR (Program for Environmental Protection and Rehabilitation), which addresses particular aspects of the project, identified in the Mining Proposal. The PEPR outlines systems of control and measurement to ensure that the proposed project minimises impacts on the environment.

Andromeda is currently waiting on feedback from the Regulators (Government) and will continue to meet with the community and all stakeholders to ensure there is a clear understanding of the Great White Kaolin Project. The next community drop-in day will be in the 3rd quarter this year.

Water supply

Water is required for the project for washing the clay and dust suppression around the mine. The project has been designed to retain and recycle over 90% of its water. A hydrogeological study was conducted as part of the mining proposal to understand the groundwater and its users. The local groundwater is limited and saline, not adequate to supply the project. The shallow mining proposed will not impact the groundwater or the ability for existing users to access groundwater.

Andromeda is working with SA Water to access the Tod Main at Poochera. The proposed water supply design includes upgrading the existing infrastructure. The existing DN200 Streaky Bay supply line will be upgraded with a parallel DN250 pipe to the Port Kenny Road offtake. The project supply will be taken at this point while still providing an additional 36% volume available for Streaky Bay and the existing Inkster line users. A dedicated line has been designed for the project to be installed adjacent to the road.

Andromeda has committed \$4,000,000 in undertaking this 17 km of infrastructure to secure water services to the region and the project.

Both Andromeda and SA Water have a commitment to ensure supply pressure in the region.

Air quality and dust

The Great White Kaolin Project has been designed to minimise dust generation. The EPA has standards that set the limits on acceptable levels of dust and the project must operate within those levels. To ensure that the dust generated from site does not exceed the limits set by the EPA, the Company will measure and record air quality data both into and out of the site, to be reported on a quarterly basis.

Dust management and minimisation is undertaken in a number of ways;

- o roads are defined and constructed using aggregates and binding agents
- o speed limits are applied on mine roads
- o maintenance of internal and access roads with use of dust suppressants
- o the staged mine development allows areas where the clay is removed, to be backfilled and revegetated to stabilise the area
 - a use of covered trucks to transport product, prior to establishing the processing plant (Stage 1 operations)
 - a the processing plant (Stage 2 -operations) is a wet process, which processes the slurry, dries and seals the product in bags for export
 - a landscaped earth bunds and boundary vegetation surrounding the operating area to provide windbreaks
 - o our workforce employed in the mine area will be trained and focussed on safe work practices minimising dust.

Transport and road safety

As part of the Great White Kaolin Project, Andromeda has committed to upgrading the Poochera - Port Kenny Road and the associated intersections. Based on recent surveys, the proposed upgrade of the road has been designed to improve the vertical and horizontal alignment. The intersections have also been analysed and upgrade designs have been provided to the Department of Infrastructure and Transport and the District Council of Streaky Bay for review and approval.

A commitment of approximately A\$9,000,000 has been made in the project development costs for the upgrade of roads.

In response to community request, Andromeda has committed to halting the product haulage along the Poochera – Port Kenny Road during the time of school bus runs.

Local jobs and contracts

Up to 75 direct jobs will be created in the Poochera/Streaky Bay region with full-scale operation of the Great White Kaolin Project. This will inject combined incomes of over \$7,000,000 per annum into the community through salaries. These employees will support the development of additional services in the region like childcare and health care.

Andromeda has a shop locally policy and opportunities for supply, contracting and other services will be available. Once the project is approved, supply requirements will be communicated through Streaky Bay's Local Business Directory. Contact the District Council of Streaky Bay to register.



The milk bottles will be baled at the Transfer Station and sent off to manufacturers for recycling into the above items.





Did you know...?

- Plastic is an incredibly versatile material, made to be strong and durable. Unfortunately, most plastics are made to be used once before being discarded.
- 660,000 tonnes of plastic waste is created by Australians every year.
- It takes Australian households 1 minute to throw out 1 tonne of plastic waste. In one day Australians produce enough plastic waste to fill an entire beach.
- It only takes 125 recycled plastic milk bottles to manufacture one 120 litre wheelie bin from recycled plastic.






