### **Council News**

### **GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION**

### Representation Review Options

Public Consultation regarding the first draft of the Representation Review has finalised with six responses being received. An Options Paper was presented to Council at the January meeting where Council resolved to essentially remain with Mayor, Wards and number of elected members as status quo. A Representation Report will now be sent out for 3 further weeks of Public Consultation as required by the Act.

### Golf Course Native Title Update

Council's solicitors have lodged the application to appeal the Golf Club decision. An update was submitted to the appeal on 24 March 2021 outlining how the original of the signed lease was found. Council and our solicitors are awaiting to hear if leave of the court (approval of the appeals process to proceed) has been given.

### Wirangu #4 Sea Claim Notification

A report was presented providing Council with information regarding the new claim and following discussion endorsed the CEO to instruct Mellor Olsson to represent Council in dealings relating to this claim.

### Local Government Reform Bill

Changes are still currently being debated by Parliament though it is focussed mostly on the cap of elected members. All other recommended changes currently appear possible.

### Oyster Lease Application

Council has received many submissions both for and against the new Oyster Lease application. The decision is not Council's to make as it is a PIRSA responsibility. PIRSA has asked for Council's submission in this matter if they wanted to make a submission.

Council resolved to provide a submission to PIRSA regarding Council's Coastal Management Plan which outlines the protection of "The Spit" and does not support the application. In addition, Council requested a comprehensive review of PIRSA's Management Plan be undertaken as soon as possible. The letter sent to PIRSA included all correspondence received by Council on the matter.

### Poochera Change Room Facility Funding

A due diligence report was presented the March 2021 ordinary meeting of Council, outlining the requirements of the funding, completion dates, and the ongoing suitability of the project, with the uncertainty of the current status of Football, with only 1 game planned for Season 2021 at Poochera. Council resolved that they were satisfied with the guarantees

provided by the club and its members and authorised the \$275,000 of funding to continue for the Change Room Facility to be built.

### Wirrulla Triangle Use

Council received a report to the March meeting of Council regarding the current status of this project. Council endorsed that the CEO confirm the expected outcomes of the project with the community before proceeding with further discussions with the BDAC

### Streaky Bay Area School Governing Council Representative

Cr Lauren Karp is now an engaged teacher at the Streaky Bay Area School and can longer represent Council on the Governing Council. Council endorsed Cr Pudney as Council's delegate an Cr Wheaton as the proxy delegate.

### Acknowledgement of Country – Council Official Meetings and Events

Council considered a request to formally resolve to undertake an acknowledgement of Country at all Council Official Meetings and Events. Council resolved that a report outlining the proposed wording be presented to the April 2021 ordinary meeting of Council.

### Electricity Procurement Engagement for 2023

A report was presented to the March 2021 ordinary meeting of Council providing details on potential participation in future electricity supply negotiations, Council authorised the CEO to participate in this.

### Calca Hall Waste Levy

A request was received from the Calca Hall Committee to waive the collection fees for the hall as the waste collection service was not utilised on a regular basis. Council endorsed the waiving of the fee.

### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

### Andromeda Metals

Andromeda (Great White Kaolin Project) have applied for a Mining Lease and Miscellaneous Purposes Licence of the Carey's Well area and the part of Poochera Port Kenny Road requiring upgrade. The Mining Lease application is out for public comment until the end of April 2021.

### Coast Protection Board Legislation Submission

Council considered and prepared a submission outlining key concerns regarding the Coast Protection Board. The submission was presented to the Coast Protection Board, South Australian Coastal Councils Alliance and Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association who were also putting in submissions.

### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

### Overhead Standpipe – SA Water

The Standpipe and its location are still being finalised, and information from SA Water is pending. Previously installed units at Ceduna and other areas are being evaluated.

### Road Construction Update

Council staff are currently working on Point Labatt Road. Staff will then be moving to Baird Bay Road.

### Road Maintenance - Patrol Grading

69% of budget expended to date.

### Parking

This was presented for community feedback in the March criterion and will be presented for Council consideration at the April 2021 ordinary meeting of Council.

### Robinson Basin

The MICW has received information from Crown Lands and SA Water on the permit application. Costing provided to date suggest that, should consent be reached, an outlay of approximately \$95k would be required to connect Robinson Basin to Wallschutzky Road catchment.

### Streaky Bay Jetty Pool Platform Extension and Shade

The MICW Team hope that this project can be completed along with the Jetty Platform Reconstruction Project. No tenders were received during the submission timeframes.

### Jetty Platform Upgrade and Future

The tender for the Reconstruction of the Jetty Platform has closed, and the project has been awarded. Final designs and products are being selected and works will begin soon.

### Tree Maintenance – Streaky Bay

Contract awarded and works underway, beginning at the Caravan Park and moving throughout the town.

### Council & Decision Making

### The Three Tiers of Government

The three tiers of government - local, state and Commonwealth - work together in various ways to govern and provide services to the community.

Local government is an elected system of government directly accountable to the local community.

The Local Government system in SA is integral to the democratic system of government in Australia which provides vital economic, social and environmental support for communities. Since the 1960s councils' roles have steadily expanded.

### Role and Functions of Council

The Local Government Act 1999 sets out the role and functions of a council.

This includes being a representative, informed and responsible decision-maker in the interests of its community:

- participating in public policy development and planning activities with the other tiers of government
- providing and co-ordinating services and facilities that benefit its area, ratepayers, residents and visitors
- developing its community and resources in a socially just and sustainable manner
- providing for the welfare, wellbeing and interests of individuals and groups within its community
- representing the interests of its community to the wider community and other tiers of government
- planning at the local and regional level for the development and future requirements of its area.
- managing, developing, protecting and conserving the environment; and
- regulating local activities such as development and building, keeping animals, parking, and maintaining public health.

### Who makes up our Council?

District Council of Streaky Bay has 8 Elected Members, who each represent wards (a ward being a specific geographic section of the Council area). The Mayor (who is part of the 8 Elected Members) is chosen by the members (not elected by the Community as Mayor).

All council members are elected for a four-year term (or less if elected at a supplementary election during the council term) and regardless of whether they are ward or area councillors, have a responsibility to consider the interests of the council area as a whole.

### Who makes decisions?

Council members combine to form the "council" that meets formally monthly and makes decisions. Council staff assist in presenting reports providing information for the decision making.

Individual council members have no authority to make decisions on behalf of the council, it is the **elected council as a whole** that has this power. Decisions of the council are made by a majority vote of the members who are present and entitled to vote (for example, they may be precluded from voting by the conflict of interest provisions of the *Local Government Act 1999*).

Council members are part of an incorporated body which has responsibility for carrying out the duties and exercising the powers conferred on the council by the *Local Government Act 1999* and other laws.

Elected Members spend a large amount of time reading reports, attending meetings and speaking with staff.

The Local Government Act specifies that council members must:


- represent the interests of ratepayers and residents;
- provide community leadership and guidance; and
- facilitate communication between the community and the council.

### Council Funding (General)

Council funds, supplemented in some cases by funding from state and Commonwealth governments, are used to deliver a diverse range of services to their local communities.

The sole source of taxation revenue for local governments is taxes on property. 1

The graph below shows the total taxation revenue collected by all levels of government in Australia from 2012-13 to 2017-18.



The graph below indicates that in 2017-18, the Commonwealth Government collected around 81% of total taxation revenue, State Government around 16% and Local Government around 3%.

### Who sets the Budget?

The process of budget (Annual Business Plan) presentation varies from Council to Council, however there are minimum legislative requirements around dates, raising of revenue and community consultation.

The final decision of raising (if any) of rates and budget allocations to projects and services remains with the Elected Members.

It is then the role of the CEO and staff to implement the Annual Business Plan within the budget set.

Any additional expenditure or budget amendments are subject to thresholds and policy requirements, however with generally larger amounts it is Elected Members who authorise these variations.

### What is the CEO Role?

The CEO is responsible to the council:

- for the implementation of council decisions and the general administration of council functions and affairs;
- for employing and managing all other council staff;
- to act as an adviser to council members; and
- to ensure the council acts within the law.

### **Local Government Partnerships Program – Western Transit Loop**

The District Council of Streaky Bay was notified this week of Premier Marshall's State Government Local Government Partnership Programs funding application success for a "Western Transit Loop" road development in the township of Streaky Bay.

The intent of Partnerships Program Funding is to rapidly deliver economic stimulus projects to drive economic growth and employment in response to the COVID-19 economic downturn, 57 projects were funded across the state including \$392,287 towards this transit loop.

The Western Transit Loop Streaky Bay is a multi-faceted project aimed to provide immediate economic stimulus and contribute to ongoing economic sustainability including jobs within our community.

The project will provide improved road access, stormwater management, safe pedestrian and cyclist access, improved road safety, traffic calming and road and associated infrastructure network to support local industry.

The project will provide improved access to key local businesses and community facilities including Doctors Beach recreational space, Streaky Bay Area School, Streaky Bay Swimming Pool, Streaky Bay Community Complex and Oval Facility and the Streaky Bay Discovery Foreshore Tourist Park. In addition, the East to West road network upgrade will provide a safe mode of travel for towing vehicles from the Port Lincoln highway into the Foreshore Tourist Park. Improved safety and road accessibility for heavy vehicles from the western farming district to bulk handling facilities will also now be possible.

Mayor Travis Barber said "It's a project that has been in the pipeline for quite a few years and we are looking forward to seeing it finally come to fruition. It will certainly look to address many of the safety concerns currently associated with Wells Street and assist heavy vehicle access through the Southern side of the township."

The project overall will align with the State's growth agenda through the provision of quality infrastructure that improves amenity, increases the region's liveability, and seeks to stimulate and sustain the economy, creating an environment conducive to attracting new residents.

Darren Walker, Manager Infrastructure Civil Works advised that final concept plans had been prepared and would be provided to Council to go out for final consultation as soon as possible. "The plans have been back and forth a few times and Council want to make sure they align with community use, safety concerns and that the roads are fit for purpose." Darren expects physical works to commence early in the new financial year, Council will await the grant agreement for final details.






