

\$41,650 Funding for Doc Woods Reserve, Haslam

The project will include footpaths, small foot bridge, fencing, play equipment and general landscaping to the Council owned Doc Woods Reserve located on the Haslam Foreshore. The project will be a collaboration between Council and the Haslam Parks and Foreshore Committee.

A total of 27 projects received funding as part of the annual Open Space and Places for People grant within the Planning and Development Fund.

The Department received 66 applications for funding. Following an assessment process, the Minister approved \$7 million to 27 projects across South Australia.

Projects funded under this initiative support the Government's priorities, including the implementation of the 30-Year Plan for Greater Adelaide and the Regional Planning Strategies for South Australia.

"The State Government continues its commitment to grassroots projects which directly benefit local communities. \$7 million towards local projects will help to provide safe and usable reserves, walking and cycling trails and playgrounds.

Ongoing investment into quality open spaces is a key driver in making our local communities more attractive, accessible and liveable".
